ARTICLE BY MIRANDA THOMAS (YEAR 9) YOUTH PARLIAMENT IN SYDNEY

Recently, I was given the opportunity to attend the inaugural Children's Week NSW Youth Parliament, organised by the YMCA and the Advocate for Children and Young People (ACYP). This two-day event took place in Sydney. One representative from Year 7 - 9 from each of the 93 electorates across NSW was selected to represent their electorate, so all together approximately 93 students were in attendance. I flew from Coffs and together with students from all over NSW, met at the ACYP Office in Sydney. Initially everyone was a little nervous, with so many unfamiliar faces, but we soon found out we had no reason to be nervous. Everyone was enthusiastic and friendly and I met so many lovely people from all over the state. The staff and volunteers who were part of this event were extremely helpful and we even met Lucy Turnbull, Malcolm Turnbull's wife, who told us about the Greater Sydney Commission and their role in our future.

We were organised into groups based on the topics we thought were of most importance to young people, such as bullying, drugs and alcohol. I was put in the Environment group and together, we had to write a speech around this topic to present to Parliament the next day. After spending a lot of the time meeting people and laughing and exchanging differences in school life, we got to work. There are so many issues concerning the environment, so we decided to focus on ideas that the NSW Parliament could act on, such as banning the use of lightweight plastic bags and educating youth on the importance of this issue. We each prepared a two minute speech and I was fortunate enough to address the plastic bag ban with a new friend I met who was from Bellingen. All groups furiously worked on their speeches until we were taken to our accommodation for the night.

The next morning everyone hastily put on their school uniforms and added a few extra tweaks to their speeches. We were all a mix of nerves and excitement. Back on the bus we got, and arrived at the NSW Parliament, where we were shown into a beautiful room with wooden panels and bookshelves thick with books. There we had a snack and heard from people from Parliament and the ACYP; following this, we entered the Green House of Representatives, or the 'bear pit' as it's known. A small introduction from Taylor Martin (a member of the Legislative Council), and the first ever Youth Parliament started.

It was so amazing to hear these insightful speeches and views from children my age, and the Environment group was lucky enough to speak in front of Justin Field, a Member of the Legislative Council for the Greens Party. Throughout the day we heard from Jihad Dib, the Shadow Minister for Education and fortunately enough, Andrew Fraser, the representative for our electorate Coffs Harbour, was in the building at the time so my friend from Bellingen and I were

invited to his office where we met him and spoke to him about the issues we felt passionate about and were told of some of his ideas for the Coffs Harbour region. To sum it all up, this was an experience that I will never forget. I met so many wonderful people and expanded my knowledge on the ways of Parliament and issues important to young people.

MATHEMATICS COMPETITIONS

This year at Coffs Harbour High School we participated in both the Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) and the University of NSW ICAS Mathematics Competition.

The results are in and congratulations go to all entrants. All who participated received their certificates at year assemblies this term.

In AMC awards are based on the following criteria:

A High Distinction Certificate is awarded to a student who has not received a higher award but is in the top 3% of their year and region.

A Distinction Certificate is awarded to a student who has not received a higher award but is in the top 20% of their year and region.

A Credit Certificate is awarded to a student who has not received a higher award but is in the top 55% of their year and region.

The Proficiency Certificate is awarded to a student who has not received a one of the above, but who has nonetheless received a satisfactory score indicating satisfactory competence at mathematics and problem solving with mathematics.




2018 AUSTRALIAN JUNIOR (SCHOOLS) SLALOM AND WHITEWATER CHAMPIONSHIPS


