FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome back to our first newsletter of 2022. The circumstances surrounding our return to school this year have certainly been difficult and uncertain. I have emailed quite a bit of communication to parents/carers and students over the last 6 or so weeks, but I really wanted to focus this newsletter on the positive start we have had to the year.

P&C AGM and general meeting

I wanted to first of all take this opportunity to remind parents that our next P&C meeting will be the annual general meeting (AGM), followed by a general meeting. Due to the lifting of COVID restrictions, this meeting can be held face-to-face in the school library (entry via the school front office – corner Nile and Edinburgh streets). The meeting starts at 7 pm on Monday 7th March.

Coping with COVID

Even with all the complications and restrictions of COVID, we have managed to return to school and maintain close to normal operation. The school has been operational and despite COVID-related staff absences there has been minimal impact on teaching, with the bulk of classes fully covered each day. I need to particularly acknowledge the efforts of both teaching and non-teaching staff in going absolutely above and beyond to keep this all happening. There have been some significant logistical challenges that we have all had to pitch in to overcome. Schools were made responsible for the distribution of many tens of thousands of rapid antigen tests to students at very short notice. We have had to manage restrictions on returning to school around mask wearing and cohorting. This has all been managed as smoothly as I could have hoped

for and I really need to thank everyone, including parents, for their cooperation and support.

I also want to acknowledge the efforts of students and the general positive tone in the school at present. Returning to school under these circumstances has been difficult but students have still been very cooperative. Despite the impact of COVID, we have still seen students making a real effort to attend and participate in school. I am particularly impressed with our senior students, who I feel have really stepped up, particularly in regard to their uniform, attendance and general maturity.

Mobile phones

We launched our new phone policy this term using the Yondr pouches. The change in the school has been remarkable. We are seeing students actually talking to each other in the playground rather than spending their breaks hunched over the phone. It has been difficult, with the wet weather and lack of facilities for students but, despite this, I believe the limiting of phone use has had a tangible positive impact on both the social playground environment and the classroom learning environment for the vast majority of our students.

Uniform

I also need to acknowledge the improvement in unform this term. We still have some students who need assistance and encouragement, but we have seen an overall significant and quite visible improvement. I again need to acknowledge the efforts of parents and students in this regard. We have assisted several students in the purchase of uniform and for those few students who are not complying with uniform requirements, we are now following through on the consequences I outlined previously. We will allow some leeway for the weather and other circumstances impacting students this term in particular, but those students consistently not wearing uniform will soon be receiving warning letters notifying them of consequences for them next term.

Facilities

I was really hoping that our new basketball courts would have been completed by the start of this term. However, due to delays with the contractor which have then been compounded with weather, we are now looking at completion near the start of Term 2. Not having access to our oval for such an extended period has been a significant imposition on our sport and PDHPE programs and I want to acknowledge the efforts of our teachers and particularly our PDHPE staff in working around these restrictions. When completed, the facility will include a double, fully covered, basketball court that will allow students somewhere protected to play in both sunny and wet weather. We are all really looking forward to this facility being completed.

Our CCTV camera system was also installed over the holidays. The main aim of the system is to prevent/deter break-ins and damage outside of hours, but the system has already proven invaluable in managing several incidents and issues. We are also in

the process of upgrading our bell system to a new wireless electronic system, which will hopefully significantly improve communication and management of the school day.

I do need to also make parents aware that we are still in the process of trying to get damage from the October 2021 storm repaired and this has been compounded by recent storm damage. Once this is completed, we will be looking into air conditioning the remainder of the school that was passed over by the state government Cooler Classrooms program. Our aim is to have every indoor classroom and workspace air conditioned. We are also hoping to have sufficient funding left to upgrade one of our kitchens later in the year. We will also invest some funding to establish a school coffee shop, to be run by students.

As you can see, there is a lot happening and soon to happen at Coffs Harbour High School. I look forward to the year ahead and want to sign off with one final thank you to everyone in our school community for such a positive and productive start to the year.


From the P&C

NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

In 2022 the following vaccines will be offered FREE:

YEARS	VACCINE	NUMBER OF DOSES
Year 7	Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine	2-doses at least 6 months apart
	Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine	Single dose
Years 10	Meningococcal ACWY vaccine	Single dose

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided
- complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
- return the completed consent form to their child's school
- ensure that their child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Please note that, to improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses during Year 7 or 8 (for HPV and dTpa vaccination) and during Year 10 or 11 (for Menignococcal ACWY vaccination).

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/withdraw_consent.aspx.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic either as a physical card or a text message sent to the mobile number recorded on the consent form. Details about vaccinations given at school will also be uploaded to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) to support complete vaccination histories.

Year 7 Vaccinations

Free vaccines, for all Year 7 students

Dear Parent/Guardian

Teams of specially trained registered nurses will be visiting your child's school during Year 7 to offer freevaccinations against serious vaccine preventable diseases.

Vaccines include:

- 1. Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine (2 doses)
- 2. **Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (dTpa)** Vaccine (1 dose)

These vaccines are only offered at school whilst your child is in Year 7.



What do you need to do?

- ✓ Read Year 7 Vaccination Information Kit which will be distributed by your school at the beginning of the school year
- ✓ Complete & sign the Consent Form (make sure you sign for each vaccine your child requires)
- ✓ Return the signed Consent Form to your child to return to school, as soon as possible.
- ✓ **Discuss the importance of vaccinations** with your child
- ✓ Ensure your child has breakfast on the morning of vaccination

Newsletter -Careers Faculty Update

Throughout this year, students at Coffs Harbour High School will be given the opportunity to participate in activities and excursions that assist them to understand the range of career, TAFE and university options available to them upon completion of secondary schooling.

The excursions and activities below are a sample, and additional opportunities will be promoted throughout the year.

Charles Sturt University Port Macquarie Open Day – Tuesday 8th March 2022, Year 12

The Port Macquarie campus of Charles Sturt University is relatively new, but it has an extensive range of courses available for students to study after secondary school. Students in Year 12 are given the opportunity to investigate the campus with other students from across the region. Cost of this excursion is approximately \$15 and places are limited. Please note that priority for places will be given to students Year 12.

University Roadshow- Friday 18th March 2022, Period 1- Years 11 and 12

Students in Year 11 are welcome to attend the University Roadshow in the Coffs Harbour High School Library during Break 1 and period 3. Representatives from Southern Cross University, Charles Sturt University, University of New England and University of Newcastle will present information on their individual universities as well as general information on how and when to apply for universities places. Students interested in attending are to write their name on the sign-up sheet outside the Careers office.

Drone Workshop – Thursday 5th May 2022, Years 9 and 10

Students from Years 9 and 10 are invited to attend a DRONE WORKSHOP as organised by AUVAIR and BASAIR Aviation College.

Drones are fast becoming an integral tool in a wide variety of industries from surveying and agriculture, to drone delivery and emergency services. A solid understanding of the drone industry will assist the next generation to gain employment and contribute in the jobs of the future. More information on how to participate will be sent out later this term.

Post Options Expo, July 2022, Year 11 and 12

Each year at this time Year 11 and 12 students are given the opportunity to discuss post school options first hand with representatives of Universities and TAFE Colleges from both NSW and Queensland in addition to Private Colleges and employment originators/providers. This excursion is held at the Coffs Harbour Education Campus.

Entry is free and ALL Year 11 and 12 students are encouraged to attend this informative event. Parents are also welcome to attend.

QLD Universities Excursion, 1st– 2nd December 2022, Year 12

The Clarence Coffs Careers Advisers Network conduct an excursion to Queensland Tertiary Institutions during term four. Students from the current Year 11 and 12 who are eligible for an ATAR and are considering studying in QLD at either Southern Cross University, Griffith University University of Queensland, Queensland University of Technology or University of Sunshine Coast after their HSC are welcome to attend. Cost is approximately \$150 and places are limited.

Midcoast Connect Year 10 Careers Expo – May 2022, Year 10

This annual careers expo is designed to assist students to think about careers, jobs and further education. A wide range of local employers and training providers get together to showcase opportunities for the future for young people. The event also assists students to plan for senior subject selections in early Term 3.

Work Experience – 20th – 24th June 2022, Year 10

Coffs Harbour High School has a reputation for delivering a well organised, respected Work Experience program for all Year 10 students. Work Experience is a compulsory activity for all Year 10 students, and students are expected to find their own placement with assistance from parents. Work Experience runs for one full week block from June 20th – 24th June 2022. Please mark these dates in your calendars.

During the last week of term one, all Year 10 students will be given a work experience package that includes information for parents and employers as well as a Student Placement Record to complete and return to school by 22nd May 2022. Students are encouraged to start considering which jobs and industries they would like to explore during the week. Should you like to receive this paperwork earlier please feel free to download the forms from the Workplace Learning/ Work Experience tab on the www.coffsharbourhighcareers.com website.

Students wishing to do work experience with organisations such as the Defence Force, Taronga Zoo and NSW Fire & Rescue should make arrangements via their respective websites as soon as possible so as to avoid disappointment.

If a student is having trouble accessing a subject area, they are to see their course teacher first or seek assistance from Mrs Court in the Careers Office.



What is Atomi?

Atomi is available 24/7 on almost any internet enabled device, which means it works at home, at school, on tablets and on smartphones. When you're ready to work Atomi will be ready to help.

How do students enrol in Atomi?

Students can log on to the site at https://getatomi.com/au using the access code in their school email that will be sent to them from the 25th March 2022 and connect with the different subject areas. If you do not remember your password, simply request a new password on the site. Your login is your school email address.

What courses are available in Atomi?

THE PROGRAM IN BRIEF

RYPEN (Rotary Program of Enrichment)

RYPEN assists young Australians aged 13-17 to:

- develop a greater sense of self-awareness.
- Appreciate diversity in society
- Realise their own and other's potential.

RYPEN provides opportunities and challenges for young people to review themselves and where they are in life and their direction in the future.

RYPEN achieves these aims through:

- Providing an environment in which they can explore their own boundaries and gain a sense of self-understanding and self-reliance.
- Challenging through active learning and problemsolving activities which are designed to stretch the mental, physical and social skills of all participants both individually and in groups.

RYPEN IN DETAIL

The Leadership team consists of Rotaract and RYLA volunteers who each bring a unique set of skills and experience.

The program is run over 2 days commencing on a Friday afternoon and finishing on Sunday afternoon.

It offers a variety of activities that allow participants to increase their knowledge and improve their skills in leadership, team building, problem solving and creative thinking. Participants also learn about understanding others.

These sessions are balanced with games and outdoor challenges that provide the opportunity to practise new skills.

All sessions are done working in teams with an assigned leader from the leadership team.

WHO CAN APPLY?

RYPEN is open to teenagers who

- Are aged between 13 and 17. Applicants need to be prepared to participate willingly in all activities. The program is open to all young people.
- Can participate in the duration of the program.
 Participants need to be free of all other commitments such as school work, sporting and family commitments for the whole program.
- must disclose all medical issues prior to camp. All medicines must be handed in on arrival and will be administered by senior camp staff.

This program is not suitable for applicants who are considered to be 'at risk' or have unmanaged aggressive behaviours.



SAFETY PROCEDURES

Rotary places the safety of our young people as their highest priority. A high staff to participant ratio is always maintained. The leadership team have CPR and First Aid qualifications and in the event of accidents, telephone contact with emergency services is always available.

All relevant COVID restrictions as set out by NSW Health will be observed. Risk Management and COVID documents will be held by Rotary.

All leaders have Working with Children which meet State Government requirements and follow the Code of Conduct available from Rotary District 9650.

RECOMMENDED READ:

A Good Girl's Guide to Murder, by Holly Jackson

A gripping, elegantly-plotted mystery that will keep you guessing until the final page. Certainly, Holly Jackson's debut novel, 'A Good Girl's Guide To Murder', has no shortage of plot twists and suspects. The story is presented as a series of project entries as we follow Pippa (protagonist) through the investigation of Andie Bell's murder.

A Good Girl's Guide To Murder tells the story of Pippa, who, for her final year school project decides to look into the closed murder case of Andie Bell. Everyone knows that five years ago Andie was murdered by her boyfriend Sal Singh, but Pippa isn't so sure. Alongside Sal's brother, Ravi, Pippa begins to uncover carefully buried secrets and it soon becomes apparent that not everyone wants her digging in the past.

The investigation is presented through project entries of transcripts, reports, messages and diagrams, allowing readers the opportunity to solve the case alongside Pip. These entries present an abundance of suspects and red herrings, keeping the reader on the edge of their seat and speculating until the end. Amid the considerable amount of evidence against each suspect and the complex plot, Holly still manages to deliver a seamless story that will satisfy readers, without leaving them confused at any point. This sensational plot never fails to surprise.

Holly's well-developed characters enhance the plot, providing the storyline with a more authentic feel. These lovable (or detestable) characters are designed to be accessible to teenage readers, and the audience will quickly form attachments to certain characters, while immediately distrusting others. Characters' physical description is satisfactory, giving just enough detail for the reader to imagine, without impeding them with overloads of information.

Holly Jackson makes no secret of the fact that she loves true crime, both podcasts and documentaries. Unsurprisingly, *A Good Girl's Guide To Murder* was inspired by podcasts like these, such as *Serial* and *They Walk Among Us*. In an interview Holly said, 'I wanted to write a book that felt like a true crime podcast investigation.' Holly's style of storytelling/ investigation should appeal to anyone who enjoys true crime.

With an abundance of suspects and much background information to begin with, Holly still manages to keep the reader on the edge of their seat, constantly shocking them with unexpected twists and turns. The suspense will have you tearing through the pages, unable to put the book down. A must read for fans of Karen McManus's 'One Of Us Is Lying'.

The year has started at a hectic pace with many COVID-19 adjustments in place and all students are focusing on their new PDHPE units for this term. In practical classes all students from Years 7-10 are undertaking a Fitness Testing Unit, to be followed shortly by a **Beach Games and Aquatics unit**. Year 12 Earth & Environmental Science Fieldtrip

On Friday 11th February the Year 12 EES class travelled up the mountain to collect first hand data for their Depth Study Assessment Task. The students were joined by John McQueen, Principal of the Cascade Environmental Education Centre, and visited three locations: Point Lookout, Weeping Rock Track, and Wright's Lookout. The students identified the ancient core of the volcano that was present and erupting at Ebor approximately 19.5 million years ago.

They then sampled soil derived from three different types of volcanic rock, collected a range of abiotic data, and identified the vegetation present at each site. This data will lead them towards developing their own inquiry question for further research and study, culminating in a journal article for submission. The group couldn't have asked for a better day weather-wise, and the students are to be commended on their enthusiasm and diligence on the day. The students then met with John at school the following Thursday where they conducted soil testing and further development of their ideas for their depth study.
































Year 7 SPECTRA

Year 9 Costume and Prop Design


