

She topped all her courses at school, which included Advanced English, Mathematics Standard, Design and Technology, Community and Family Studies and Visual Arts. Rhiana went on to achieve our top results in the HSC and is going on to study to become a teacher – something we definitely need more of. Congratulations Rhiana!





## - FROM THE PRINCIPAL —

In speaking of the achievements of our past students, our school has had several students move on to make significant contributions to our country and our society. The school maintains a "Hall of Fame" featuring several famous and successful ex-students, and so I wanted to make parents aware of another famous ex-student who will also be joining our Hall of Fame. Peter Reichenbach OAM, Dip PE, BSc, MSc, PhD (1934 – 2023) attended Coffs Harbour High School from 1949 – 1951 and went on to make a significant contribution to Physical Education and Sport. Peter became a teacher after leaving school before moving on to study at the University of Oregon in the US, where he eventually completed his PhD in 1972. He then returned to Australia to create and establish a degree course in Physical Education before being appointed as the Dean of Biomedical and Health Science and Head of Anatomy and Physiology at the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology (RMIT). Peter went on to serve as the Chairman of the State Sports Council, the Olympic Park management Board, as Vice President of ACHPER and as a founding board member of the Victorian Institute of Sport. He was awarded the Order of Australia Medal in 1998 and the Centenary Medal in 2001 for contributions to Physical Education and Sports Science and the community. Peter is a fitting addition to our Hall of Fame.



Finally, a reminder to all students and parents/carers that all students return to school on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> April. We will begin the day with a whole-school assembly and roll call in the hall for Years 7 -11 (Year 12 will attend their normal roll call rooms).

#### Mid North Coast Science and Engineering Challenge (SEC)

On Tuesday the 8th of April, 2025, 27 CHHS students travelled to Woolgoolga to compete in the annual Mid North Coast Science and Engineering Challenge (SEC).

They were in a battle up against 7 other schools, including: Maclean, Grafton, South Grafton, Woolgoolga, Orara, Toormina and Bishop Druitt College.

The day started off as more than a challenge for some groups, but once they understood the tasks, they worked well as teams to be placed first at the half way mark after calculating the totals of 6 challenges until the lunch break.



The second half rotations saw even more confused students scratching their heads wondering what they had got themselves into at the SEC. Several groups excelling in efficiency and completed their tasks ahead of schedule and to a high standard.

At the end of the day there were two full day activities, the Eco-Habitat and the Bridge Building. CHHS's Eco-Habitat group faired well in the majority of the scoring categories to finish in the top three, but it all came down to the final bridge weight and strength testing.

Chris Hoza, Nathan Clarke, Gurtej Singh and George Fletcher were the engineering's who designed and built the "Jetty Bridge". They were the only group that succeeded to test the 4.5kg "bridge buster" weight, taking out the bridge building task.

But, it would all come down to the final combined calculations of all 14 tasks.

Coffs Harbour High School, once again, takes out the Science and Engineering Challenge for 2025!

















It must be noted that many of the SEC volunteers commended CHHS students on their uniform, behaviour, teamwork, manners and overall general participation throughout the whole day. An absolute credit to all the students who represented CHHS at the 2025 Mid North Coast Science and Engineering Challege.





On Friday the 21st of March the Opens Girls Touch Football team travelled to steamy hot South Grafton to play in the MNC Knockout and for selection for the MNC team.

In the first match the eleven-player squad came up against South Grafton High school and quickly put on a 4 try spree thanks to the great leadership from the captain Shalarra Craig. Coffs Harbour HS took out that game comfortably 7 tries to 4.

In the second game of the day, they came across a fresh Woolgoolga HS, a team made up of a squad of 14 girls, with more than half of them playing in the area's representative teams. The Woopi girls crossed for the first two tries. This made it difficult for the Jetty girls to make a come back, considering that they had already played a tough match previous to taking on the competition favourites. Woopi ended up taking out the match 6 tries to 2, with the Jetty girls showing true grit and spirit holding strong in defence, but missing a few scoring opportunities.

The final match of the day saw Jetty High take on Toormina HS. Thanks to sizzling tries from Selma and Tess, Jetty got an early two try lead. They had a few miscommunication errors which saw Toormina score two tries. But, that did not stop the girls running away with a nice win, beating Toormina 5 tries to 2.

Coffs Harbour High School came out third overall on the day and had five players chosen to play in the possible and probables match. A massive congratulations to Layci Teale, Savannah Stephens and Isabel Kelly in making through to the Mid North Coast Open's Girls team who will represent in South Grafton on Friday the 4th of April.

Congratulations must be given to every player from Coffs Harbour High School for displaying excellent behaviour, sportsmanship and commitment for the entire tournament.

It must be noted, that eight of the eleven girls in the team also played in the local touch competition grand finals on Monday the 24th of March. Each of the respective teams lost to more experienced teams two tries to three.

We recently held a BBQ fundraiser, raising \$282.50 for our chosen cause, Birthing Kits Australia. These kits were sent to women in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Nigeria, Zimbabwe, and in the Pacific Islands, including the Solomon Islands, Kiribati, and Papua New Guinea. For these women, one kit can truly mean the difference between life and death.

This year, our goal is to raise at least \$1,000 over the next few terms, enabling us to purchase 200 birthing kits. We're excited to continue making a meaningful difference in the lives of women around the world.
