- FROM THE PRINCIPAL -

As we reach the end of Term 2, I wanted to thank all our students and particularly our staff, for their efforts over the term. I wanted to thank parents for their perseverance over what has been quite an extended period of wet weather. I am hopeful that things will now fine up for the break and moving into next term. I hope everyone has a great break and enjoys this finer weather. A reminder that school resumes for students in Term 3 on Tuesday 22nd July. It will be a week A and we will start with a school assembly in the hall for our morning roll call. I would also like parents to be aware that our Head Teacher Inclusive Learning, Mrs Garrels, has been seconded into a relieving Department of Education Learning and Wellbeing Officer consultancy position for the remainder of the year. Mrs Guthrie will be relieving Head Teacher in her absence.

School Academic Reports

We expect to have all our mid-year Years 7 – 11 academic reports available for parents from the end of term. I made the call earlier this year to suspend and re-schedule some of our formal assessment tasks and exams during the two major weather events we have experienced. I did not want students adversely impacted when they were potentially cut off from school or while families were managing bigger issues. This meant that I subsequently compressed the time that teachers had to finalise their assessment and reporting. I do appreciate the fact that staff have done their best to accommodate these changes.

Coffs Harbour Jetty Foreshore Planning Proposal

I would like the school community to be aware that I have made a public submission as part of consultation for the Jetty Foreshore Planning Proposal. The submission was done in my capacity as a public servant and as Principal of the school, representing the interests of students, staff and parents. It in no way reflects my personal opinion or approval/disapproval of the proposal. Instead, it reflected concerns I had relating to the impact on the school, and particularly the impact on student and staff safety. For those unaware, the proposal would appear to have a major impact on the traffic and use of Camperdown Street.

— FROM THE PRINCIPAL —

Camperdown Street is on the eastern boundary of the school and our students must cross at the pedestrian crossing here throughout the day to access our oval across the road, as well as when moving down to the Jetty area for sport and other activities, and at the start and end of the day moving to and from school. It appeared to me that the proposal will involve a much greater use of Camperdown Street as a major access to the new development. For this reason, I raised concerns regarding the impact of the development and, in a positive sense, put forward proposals for several measures I feel should be included in planning to mitigate these impacts. I would assume that my submission will be publicly available. As it is more than five pages in length, I did not want to include it here in full, but I did feel it worth sharing with you a summary of the measures I have proposed be investigated to help mitigate the concerns I expressed.

•There is ample room to make the entry/exit from Marine Parade more efficient, reducing the need for increased traffic flow on Camperdown Street.

·If traffic is to increase on Camperdown Street, work must be done on the intersection to manage the traffic flow turning right onto Harbour Drive.

•There is currently no traffic calming device at all on Camperdown Street. This is particularly an issue for traffic coming downhill at speed towards Harbour Drive. I propose raising the pedestrian crossing for the school. This would make the crossing safer for children and ensure traffic is slowed before entering Harbour Drive.

•Given the increased traffic and given that children are having to cross Camperdown Street throughout the day, the end of Camperdown Street, preferably the area running along the boundary of the school, should be made into a flat 40 Km/hr zone (rather than just a school zone). This would be significantly safer for children and consistent with the speed limit of Harbour Drive in the area leading to and from the intersection with Camperdown Street.

•With increased traffic down Camperdown Street, given the amount of pedestrian traffic crossing at the end of the street at Harbour Drive, it would be worth investigating pedestrian barriers/fencing on the corner to help direct pedestrians to the pedestrian refuge and/or crossing. This could be extended up Harbour Drive and Camperdown Street on the school boundary to manage students getting off and onto school buses, with appropriate access points for the buses that pull up along these boundaries.

•The proposed pedestrian bridge would be more ideally situated where it is most likely to be used, in closer proximity to the Jetty Strip shops and shopping centre on Harbour Drive. This is particularly relevant to our school because we are often moving large numbers of students down to the Jetty area for sport/PE lessons and large numbers of young people independently frequent the Jetty area on foot outside of school operation. This would put this foot traffic closer to the Jetty itself and avoid having large numbers of young people moving through what will essentially be a significant residential area.

If the development goes ahead as proposed then I am very much hoping that the concerns I have raised and the potential solutions I have put forward are given serious consideration.

RE: School Bus Travel & SSTS Pass Requirement

We'd like to remind families that all students travelling on our school bus services must have a valid bus pass under the NSW School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS)—either a School Bus Pass or a School Term Bus Pass. Drivers are required to check passes upon boarding, and students without one may be refused travel.

How to Apply

Applications must be made online through the Transport for NSW portal. Please visit:

Free School Bus Pass (if eligible): <u>https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/transaction/apply-for-a-school-travel-pass</u>

Paid School Term Bus Pass (for ineligible students): <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ApplyTBP</u>

You'll need to complete the application and nominate our bus company as the operator. The school will then confirm the details. If approved, your child's pass will be sent by post.

Eligibility & Use

Eligibility for free travel:

·Kindergarten to Year 2: automatically eligible
·Years 3–6: must live 1.6 km+ (straight line) or 2.3 km+ (walking) from school
·Years 7–12: must live 2.0 km+ (straight line) or 2.9 km+ (walking) from school

Students must:

•Carry and show their pass to the driver each day •Only use the pass for travel between home and school •Follow the Code of Conduct for School Students on Buses
