FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Despite some minor disruption from recent extreme weather, it has been a very smooth start to the 2025 school year. We have had two new teachers appointed to our teaching staff this year: Ms Krystal Morris in our Inclusive Education and Support faculty and Ms Holly Cork Rappell in our Creative and Performing Arts faculty. Ms Morris has been appointed due to an increase in our Inclusive Education classes. We now have five classes at our school supporting the diverse needs of students with a range of disabilities and learning difficulties. On behalf of our school community, I want to extend a warm welcome to all our new staff, both permanent and temporary. I would also like to announce that the school recently ran a merit selection process to appoint a new permanent Deputy Principal. Mr Hayden Gardiner has been appointed to this position, starting Term 2 of this year. Mr Gardiner comes to us from Melville High School and is currently relieving Deputy Principal at Orara High School. I wanted to take this opportunity to thank both Ms Angela Kellahan and Mr Michael Morgan, who have both been relieving as Deputy Principal and Head Teacher Mathematics, respectively. I particularly wanted to acknowledge the outstanding leadership of Ms Kellahan. Ms Kellahan has been relieving as Deputy Principal and at times as relieving Principal, over the last three years. In this time, she has worked tirelessly to support several school initiatives, particularly in relation to Aboriginal Education and Literacy and Numeracy. Ms Kellahan has developed strong and productive working relationships with several students and their parents/carers. We are very lucky to have her on our team.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

With the appointment of Mr Gardiner, the school is now in the position of having a full staffing compliment. This is a great position to be in, given the context of staffing shortages and how this has impacted the school previously.

When I say we have had a good start to the year I mean it, and I do put this down to a number of factors, one of which is our more stable staffing. Having said that, we did of course have the disruption of Tropical Cyclone Alfred last week. I appreciate that this will have been disruptive to many families, but I also appreciate the fact that the government and Department of Education were willing to be decisive in terms of ensuring that all our students and staff were kept safe during this event. While we may not have had any significant impact on our school infrastructure/facilities as a result of the cyclone, given the forecasting and warnings from meteorological and emergency response agencies, I feel that decisions erring on the side of keeping people safe are always the right ones to make. On returning to school after this event, I am happy to say that we have school operations back on track. Our Years 7 and 9 students are completing NAPLAN this week and we will have our whole-school Harmony Day assembly this Friday. The regional swimming carnival has now been rescheduled, allowing our students to compete for progression to the state carnival later this term. The Coffs Coast International Women's Day breakfast was also delayed by the cyclone, and I was privileged to attend the re-scheduled event this Wednesday morning, along with several of our female student leaders and staff. All-up, it has been a busy term. I look forward to a smooth end to the term and hope to catch up with many of our parents and carers at our Parent Teacher Evening on Tuesday 1st April (details and links to make interview bookings will be available early next week).



SRC REPORT

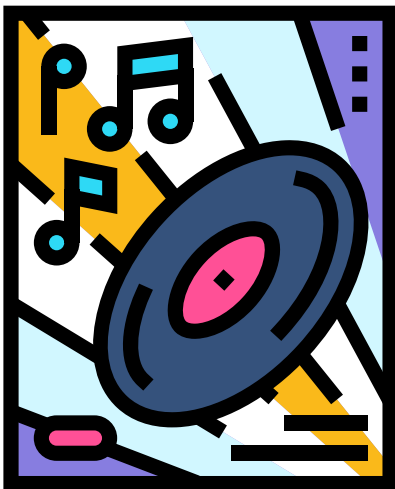

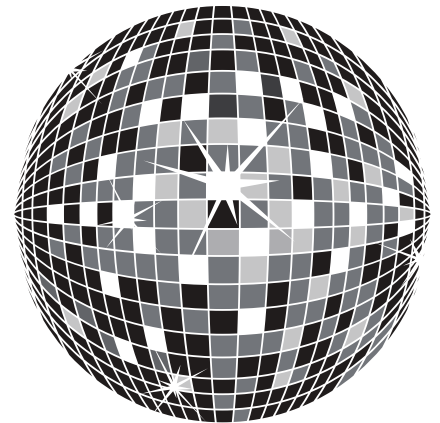
Tickets are \$10 and can be purchased through School Bytes as well as signing the permission note. If you can't access through School Bytes then students can obtain a permission note from office and pay there.

Premier's Reading Challenge

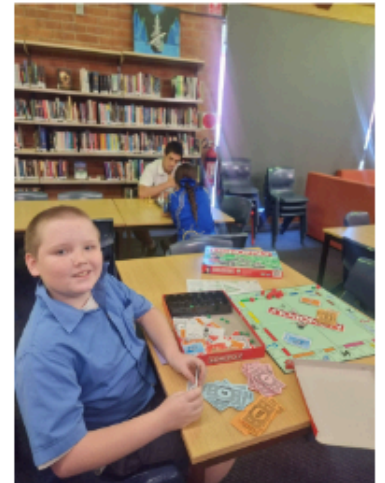

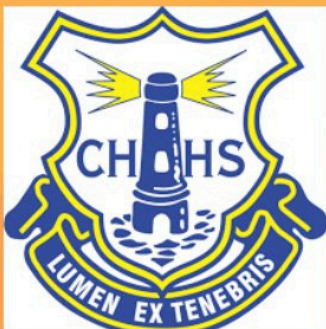

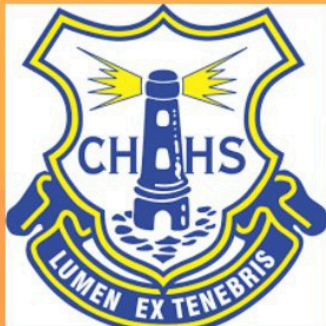

Congratulations to our Open Netball Girls on their efforts at the MNC Opens Netball Gala Day.

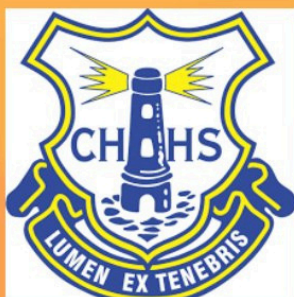
The team had a wide variety of experience, including some who were playing their first organised game of netball, and was made entirely of junior girls (Year 10 or younger).

Welcome to the world of senior school! You've officially made it to Year 11, and with that comes new opportunities, new responsibilities, and of course, the privilege of wearing your white senior shirts. You're now the role models for the younger students, and we know you'll set a great example.

A few big things to keep in mind as we kick off the year:

Senior Jackets – Orders will be opening soon, with an estimated cost of \$85-\$100. More details to come, so start thinking about whether you want one!

Heron Island Excursion – This is a once-in-a-lifetime chance to explore the reef and get hands-on with some scientific fieldwork. The cost is \$1250, and spots are limited to the first 44 students who get their notes and deposits in—so don't wait too long!

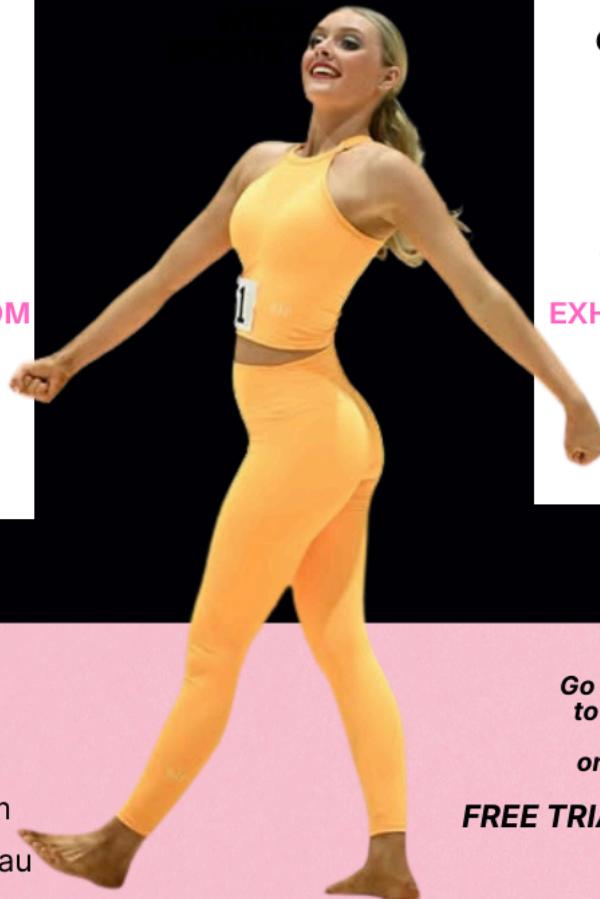
